


ARRIVALS: SYR Hancock International Airport


- SYR is a small airport

Communicating Your Needs

Note that your parents can't fix a problem if one arises and involving them first often increases the time it takes for us to resolve an issue.

Required vs Optional

 As a Summer College student, you are required to attend to all your academic obligations.

 You are encouraged to engage in the Summer College community events but participation in those events, activities, and weekend trips are completely optional.

Res' Life

- Summer College residence hall assignments are Flint and Day Halls on the Mount.
- Specific hall assignments will be communicated via email the week of your move-in date.
- Secure residence halls are dedicated exclusively to pre-college students
- Roommates are assigned based on factors including gender identity, age, graduation year, classes enrolled, etc.
- You will find out about your roommate assignment on the day of move-in.
- We cannot provide roommate information ahead of time.
- Most room styles are open doubles. Both halls have "pod" style bathrooms.
- Laundry facilities are in the basement of each residence hall.
- Laundry machines are free of charge. You will need to bring/purchase laundry detergent.









Res' Life

- The residence hall floors are gender exclusive; students are not allowed to visit other floors.
- SRCs (Summer Residential Counselors), SRAs (Summer Residential Assistants) and SRIs (Summer Residential Interns) occupy rooms distributed throughout the floors of both halls.
- Opposite gendered staff may be assigned to floors depending on staff availability, all staff have been through background checks and will be wear name tags while on duty.
- Nightly curfew applies. Students can request to go off campus during the day outside of class time.
- Overnight away can be approved with parental permission. Request forms will be available in the electronic format. Curfew is lifted at 6am daily.
- There is no AC in the residence hall rooms, fans are strongly encouraged.
- You are encouraged to visit SU Housing guidelines for prohibited items. Mail delivery is not available to the residence halls.



Medical accommodations

Medication

- Students self administer their own medications
- If injection by a health care professional is needed, please contact Barnes Center Pharmacy.
- If you need to ship refrigerated medication, please contact Barnes Center Pharmacy. Do not ship to residence hall or Summer College office!

Disability Related Accommodations

- Please follow the instructions on our website to reach out to the Center of Disability Resources to submit formal request.
- Accommodation requests require processing time, please submit as soon as possible.



Dining

- Students are on full meal plans of 19 meals/week.
- All meals are taken in Ernie Davis Dining.
- Meal swipes are accessible as soon as students pick up their SUID card at check-in.
- If there are any dietary restrictions, please contact Campus Dining through the dietary accommodation process posted on our website.
- Multiple restaurants are within walking distance on Marshall Street for students with their own funds who want alternate options.

Move-out

- Move out begins after class ends on Friday. The exact time varies based on your course, so check with faculty.
- Students must be moved out by noon on the Saturday after your class ends.
- Move-out shuttle must be reserved via the transportation form.
- Please empty and clean out your fridge, room, and drop your key at front desk.
- No parents are allowed inside the halls during move-out.

To Do: Complete Requirements on the Admitted Student Page

- 1. Pay your balance by the deadline / Confirm your seat
- 2. Submit the required forms
 - Policies and Procedures (All students)
 - Travel (Arrival and Departure)
 - Immunizations
 - Health & Insurance Cards
- 3. Activate Your NetID
- 4. Visit your Syracuse University Email Account (SUMail.syr.edu)
 - When logging in you will use <u>YOURNETID@syr.edu</u> as the username and password created
 - Wait 48 hours after activating your NetID (Note: your SUID# is not your NetID)

To Do: Complete Requirements on the Admitted Student Page

- 5. Submit your SUID photo (On Campus & On Location students)
- 6. Request additional services if necessary.
- 7. Complete your Asynchronous Orientation in Blackboard
- 8. Review move-in information and submit transportation forms
- 9. Review the Packing List which includes items NOT to bring
- (Examples: items like conventional extension cords and halogen lamps are prohibited in the residence halls.)
- 10. Check your @syr.edu email for an update from your faculty. They should open your course in Blackboard at least one week prior to the start of your class.

Tips for your Asynchronous Orientation:

- Ensure to complete it in its entirety
- Do NOT skip sections
- Follow the modules in sequence
- There are quizzes sprinkled throughout the orientation
- Approximately 1 hour to complete (does not need to be completed all at once)

Word of Caution

Failure to complete the checklist item requirements on the Admitted Student webpage will result in the following:

- Residential students will not be permitted to check-in or move into Flint Hall or Day Hall.
- Residential, Commuter, Online, and On Location students will be denied access to their class and class content in Blackboard.
